Wild West District Record Book Policy Approved February 2024

- 1. The Wild West District will be using the ZBOOKS format for all record books.
 - a. Instructions can be found on the 4-H and Wild West District Websites
- b. Option One (ZBOOKS online) or Option Two (Form Fillable PDFs) will be acceptable
- 2. A Complete Record Book has the following:
 - a. Personal Page with all enrolled projects listed alphabetically.
 - b. Permanent Pages
- c. Project Report Forms for at least one project for Juniors and 2 projects for Intermediates and Seniors. Youth can submit as many projects as they want that they are enrolled in. The Project Report must include:
- 1. Required Number of Goals (Section 1) for each project: Jr.- 2-4 goals, Intermediate 4-6 goals, and Sr. 6-12 goals. You can have more.
- 2. Relevant Content in Sections 2-6.
- 3. Finances (Section 7): All pages and information must be complete and columns added for totals.

NOTE: All projects that have expenses need to be listed on the Finances pages.

- 4. Project Reflections (Section 8): Jr. All questions must be answered, Intermediates at least 3 good paragraphs about your project work, and Sr. at least 5 good paragraphs about your project work. You can have more.
- 5. Photos (Section 9): At least one page of 2-6 photos.

2024 General Rules

- 1. Haskell County will not be held responsible for any damages to, or losses of, property for the duration of the show.
- 2. The show management reserves the right to alter and/or combine classes as seen fit. All show day announcements take precedence over previous announcements.
- 3. All exhibitors will keep their areas clean at all times.
- 4. Only 4-H and FFA members are eligible to enter. Exhibitors must be 7—18 years of age as of 1/1/24 to exhibit. Exhibitors must own animals shown including showmanship. (Exception: If exhibitor has 2 or more animals in same class.) Only animals entered in show are eligible for showmanship classes.
- 5. Lambs will show slick shorn & free of active club lamb fungus lesions.
- 6. State of Kansas Animal Health Department requirements for County Show will be followed. No intact male animals may be shown.
- 7. Livestock that is shown in breeding classes CANNOT be shown in market classes. Registration papers may be requested by Show Staff if needed for breed clarification.
- 8. Weathers and does may be shown in the Meat Goat Show. All market goat will be shown clipped to 3/8" or less. Breeding does do not have to be clipped.
- 9. All classes will be split by weight.
- 10. All goats and sheep must have an official USDA Premise Tag to be eligible for the show.
- 11. This show will be a "Blow & Go." The use of paint, glue/adhesives and boning soaps will NOT be allowed. No hair coloring will be allowed in grooming of any livestock exhibit. Attempts to alter animal color of breed character including the addition of hair or other added material, natural or manmade is prohibited. All livestock exhibits will be subject to inspection and handling by the Haskell County Spring Livestock Show Committee and/or their agents at any time.
- 12. Barns will be open for any members who wish to bring their animals the night before.
- 14. The show management reserves the right for weigh back. (10lbs Hogs, 5lbs Sheep & Goats, 10% Beef)


