Make sure to look at the one for permanent records. Only the information from this 4-H year needs to be entered into the ZSuite program. You do not need to go in and enter your previous years' information. Just make sure when you turn in your record book that you include your previous permanent record along with the new one. You no longer have to submit a general 4-H story or general pictures.

#### **Enrollment Opens on October 1st**

Reminder: returning 4-H members must be enrolled by December 1st to be eligible to show at the 2022 county fairs. First year members must be enrolled by May 1st. May 1st is also the project add/drop deadline. You must be enrolled in the projects in which you will to exhibit at fair. For those new 4-H members interested in livestock, you must be enrolled before the appropriate species weigh in deadline dates.

#### What is 4-H Cloverbuds?

An educational, youth development opportunity specifically for 5 and 6 – year old children. To be eligible to participate, a child must have celebrated his or her 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> birthday before January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year.

Cloverbuds is an age-appropriate educational opportunity; a Cloverbud cannot be a 4-H club member at the same time.

The Cloverbuds program does not require a membership fee!

When a child reaches the age of eligibility for traditional 4-H programs (age 7 or older before January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year), the child and his or her parent(s) or guardian(s) can decide whether to transition their child into 4-H club membership.


