### Horse and Horseless Horse Projects

Horse ID Papers

All members enrolled in the horse project must submit ID papers for the horse(s) they intend to show. Completed ID papers, including a photo of the horse are all due May 1st. For more information contact your local Extension Office.

Our SW District Horse Show has been scheduled for Tuesday, June 29, 2021 in Dodge City, unless prevented by COVID restrictions.

### **Horse Panorama**

Due to Rock Springs' current closure, the Horse Panorama will not be held in January. Instead, the Horse Action Team will host Hippology, Public Speaking, Demonstrations/Talks, Photography, Logo, Poster, Power-Point, Ad Layout, and Model Horse Show virtually in 2021. The exact dates are yet to be determined.

In addition, Quiz Bowl will join Horse Judging and be hosted with our Kansas Horse Council partners at Equifest March 5-7 in Salina. This plan will be tentative as the public health situation is closely monitored. If covid-19 restrictions prevent Kansas 4-H from hosting these contests in the spring, the Horse Action Team is exploring virtual options.

### **YQCA Training Update**

We will again be using the YQCA program for our livestock quality assurance class this year. All livestock exhibitors with intentions to participate in your county fair must complete your YQCA certification. Also, those that show livestock at the Kansas State Fair and/or Kansas Junior Livestock Show must have completed the certification to be eligible to show. This applies to all market and breeding animals. There





will probably be some face-to-face training dates offered this spring. The YQCA training is also offered online. However, seven year old members are not eligible for the online training.

Please note: New this year, counties in the Wild West District are charging a \$10 participation fee per 4-H'er participating in BB gun, air rifle pellet pistol and small-bore project meetings. This is an annual fee and will cover participation for the entire shooting season in the project areas listed above. Funds collected will be used to purchase new equipment (BB guns, targets, ammo, etc.).

Should the season of project meetings end up being canceled due to COVID-19 restrictions, a refund of some type will be initiated.

### **Apply for Hosting Academic Year Students**

States' 4-H International Exchange Programs is planning Academic Year Programs (AYP) with Japan (Labo and LEX), Korea (Better Futures Education and Korea 4-H) and the US government-sponsored FLEX (Future Leaders Exchange) and YES (Youth Exchange and Study) for the 2021-2022 school year. FLEX selects students of countries in Europe and Asia which were formerly under Communist governments. YES selects students of Southern Europe, Africa and Asia who are from countries with large Muslim populations. All of these government-sponsored students have high ability and good English skills.

We will begin receiving applications about the end of January, 2021. Kansas families who would like to host an academic year student can review student

bios and select a student they believe will fit well in their families. Apply now, so you can be approved to host AYP's and you will be ready to choose a student as soon as they arrive. This is an ideal opportunity to host for parents who work outside the

### **Updated: Junior Producer Days to be Virtual**

The 2021 KSU Junior Producer Days will be hosted virtually as week-long educational events this year. Kansas Junior Swine Producer Week will be February 15-20, 2021, with Kansas Junior Meat Goat Producer Week being March 15-20. There



will be a few presentations throughout the week, with each of the programs wrapping up on Saturday morning.

All of the sessions will be recorded and shared with those who register, so families may participate at their own pace and as their schedule allows.

The Junior Day events will be free this year, thanks to our gracious sponsors, but all participants will still need to register. This includes both youth and adults. Families also need to use an email address someone from the household checks on a regular basis, as that is the method of communication we will use to share links and specific details with attendees.

Participants will need to register for Swine Producer Week by February 8, and Meat Goat Producer Week by March 8, to receive the appropriate information.

### **K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy**

Students from across the country with an interest in the livestock industry and related careers can apply for the Kansas State University Animal Sciences Leadership Academy (KASLA). The academy is an intensive four-day educational experience designed to enhance the leadership skills and animal science knowledge of students in ninth through 12th grades. Hosted by the K-State Department of Animal Scienc-



es and Industry and sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council (LMIC), the academy's goal

is to develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a successful future in this field.

The program's itinerary will feature interactive workshops, tours and faculty mentor time with animal sciences and industry professors. Industry leaders will also join the participants frequently to share their knowledge and expertise. Throughout the week, participants will work in teams to evaluate current events within the animal science industry and educate others. This experience will culminate with team presentations and a closing reception on Saturday morning.

Only 20 students will be accepted for each session to ensure individualized attention from counselors, professors and industry leaders. Participants will stay on campus in university housing with program staff for the duration of the event. Transportation to and from the event is the responsibility of the participant, along with a \$50 fee to reserve his or her space. This fee is only due upon acceptance and not at the time of application. The Livestock and Meat Industry Council generously provides all other sponsorships.
