Treasurers, Club Leaders, and Project Leaders we would like to bring some rules and guidelines to your attention about raising money for your clubs or projects (not on an individual basis). First and foremost, if your club or project is planning a fundraiser or planning to apply for a grant you MUST inform the local extension office before making an announcement. This ensures that we do not have multiple fundraising events going on at the same time as well as, providing information as to what the money will be used for. If we become aware of the fundraiser or grant after the fact your club or project may have to forfeit that money. The Wild West District Board is accountablefor all funds generated for Extension programs which include 4-H.




